From The Pastor

It is commonly thought that prophets foretell the future. This is not exactly true. Prophets more often reveal future consequences due to present realities. A prophet is one who, after listening to the word and will of God, reveals to the people present danger in the current course of things. Such prophecy is the wisdom of God's mercy with the intention and hope that wayward or consequential behavior may be corrected.

I am not a prophet, but I must inform you of concerning information that will in the near and distant future create negative consequences. It is evident that the pandemic had a negative impact on the number of people able or willing to participate at Mass in person. One negative consequence of the absence of more than fifty percent of our previous congregation is a much smaller number of people actively supporting the parish financially.

In 2018-19 before the pandemic, our annual offertory was \$446,723. In 2019-20 as Covid began, the annual offertory was \$373,621. In 2020-21, \$300,888. July to June 2021-2022, the current fiscal year just ending, our offertory was \$294,370. In the course of these few years our annual offertory has had a decrease of \$152,353. Further, prior to the pandemic our average weekly number of contributors was 280. Currently, only 115 persons are financially supporting our parish on a weekly basis through the parish envelope. A handful of people offer online or in cash. This is unsustainable. With these numbers and the current monies received through the offertory our parish operations are not sustainable.

Currently we have 750 registered families. Three-hundred seven of these families receive parish envelopes. Of these, 115 are used. Other income sources for the year include School lease income, Christmas collection, faith formation income, and miscellaneous income. These numbers are printed in this bulletin.

This information is not prophetic. It is simply factual. I would be remiss and irresponsible to not point out these disparities. Thank you to those who are so faithfully supporting the parish. We will stay the course and do what we can to improve this circumstance. Please do all you can to support the parish. If you are actively participating at Mass and our parish life, please support us in whatever way you are best able.

I am open to your suggestions of how to invite others back to Mass. A big part of this is with you. Invite, welcome, and encourage those who previously

attended to please return in an active way. People are always more important than money. We need Christ and one another for the enrichment and salvation of our souls. Monetary support is a meaningful part of a faith commitment and church support.

Going forward we will continue to livestream both the Saturday and Sunday Masses. Many legitimately need this form of engagement. However, these Masses will no longer be posted on our website or YouTube. If you must participate through video, you must do so at the scheduled Mass times. There are no longer any dispensations from Mass beyond valid illness or home circumstance that disallows personal presence. We need you and you need us. Please return.

With the encouragement of our Moderator in the Family of Parishes, despite our cash crunch, we have hired a Faith Formation Director who will also take a lead in creating initiatives for evangelization. The hope is that we can build up the parish through Religious Formation and creative evangelization programs. Mr. Matthew Zinzer will be on-board as of this week. A time for a personal introduction will be forthcoming.

Please pray for our parish and these troubling concerns. I am hopeful and trusting in the Lord's providence. This is information you should know about to share in the concern and to assist in the solution.

Mercy is the source and foundation of all we believe in the mystery of God's Divine Love as revealed through Jesus. In the attitude of the Pharisees, mercy is a radical and ridiculous scandal actively resented and rejected. For true believers, mercy is an extravagant and divinely generous gift that reveals the essence of God incarnate in the Lord Jesus.

The response to mercy is mercy. Notice St. Paul is filled with gratitude and praise despite all his unworthiness that Christ should not only mercifully redeem him, but to also use him as a minister of the gospel. In the realization of Christ's mercy, St. Paul owned, admitted, and confessed his sin. Only in this humility could Paul deeply understand the power and the gift he was given. The prodigal son did the same accepting his father's embrace. The older brother refused mercy to his brother while rejecting the father's plea to share the joy of his brother's return. With blinding self-justification, the older brother traps himself in a prison of his own making. Mercy received becomes mercy given. Let God love you. Accept God's mercy. Be mercy for others.

September 18 is National Singles Day. INTERGENERATIONAL HEALING MASS

All are invited to join Fr. John in prayer to heal the negative influences of past generations for the benefit of current and future generations.

What is intergenerational healing?

We all understand the concept of material inheritance. After people die, they often leave money, property and possessions to family members.

We are also aware of a physical inheritance. Doctors always ask for the family medical history of a new patient. There is also a spiritual inheritance. We can thank God and family for the benefit from our virtuous ancestors going back a thousand generations (see Sirach 44:10-12). We are also adversely affected by the sins of parents, grandparents and great-grandparents and by the sins of the ancestors, who adversely affected them, with consequences that may extend to what is inherited materially, emotionally and physically.

In his book entitled *Intergenerational Healing*, Fr. Robert De Grandis writes: "intergenerational healing is, for the Christian, an opportunity to recognize and bring healing to family influences from the past, with implications for the future. Intergenerational healing suggests the possibility that negative acts and deeds of our ancestors can somehow enter our "bloodstream" and take a toll on future generations. Transforming the connection with these troublesome roots is what intergenerational healing is all about. It's an exciting, fascinating area of the healing ministry."





ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS - "OCIA"

A new change has been made in the title of the process in which adults are prepared in the Catholic Church for Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist, and for reception into the Catholic Church for persons already Baptized in another Christian tradition. Formerly known as "RCIA" or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, the process will now be referred to as "OCIA" or "Order of Christian Initiation of Adults." "Why the change?" you may ask. This is a change that focuses on the initiation process, recognizing the candidates for the sacraments of initiation are in a life-changing journey within the Catholic community. Upon participation in the "Rite of Acceptance" at which candidates express their free choice to pursue preparation for the Sacraments, they officially are welcomed into the Church's "Order of Catechumens" which affords them certain rights in the church.

The ongoing support of our local faith community is essential for this journey. So please pray for those who may be considering a call to Baptism within our parish. 

**Twenty-fourth Sunday
in Ordinary Time**

If we were reflecting on all of today's scriptures and wanted to come up with one intimate name for God, perhaps it would be "God of Second Chances." Over and over we see examples of God offering just that. In Exodus, the Lord is frustrated by the behavior of the people, and Moses, speaking very boldly, has to talk God into calming down and recalling the covenant

with Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Israel. Psalm 51, "The Miserere," is the great psalm of repentance and cleansing. Take the time to read and pray with the whole psalm at your leisure. Paul confesses his own blasphemy and arrogance, and how Christ is using it now. In the extensive Gospel from Luke we experience Jesus using parables to tell about the widow and the lost coin, the shepherd and the lost sheep, and the lost son and a loving father's welcome.

TAKE ALL THE LOST HOME

In the 70s there was a popular Folk Mass song by Joe Wise, "Take All the Lost Home." It is like our Gospel reading today. For truly, we've all had moments when we have lost our way and needed others to get us back on track. Perhaps this means reconnecting with someone we once knew and making amends, or seeing a therapist to make things right. Maybe it means finally seeking help to stick with the diet and exercise plan, or joining a 12-step program to deal with an addiction. Could it be time to meet with a financial expert to manage credit card debt, or go to confession or meet with a spiritual director to find your way home spiritually? It is hard to ask for help or admit we are lost. We dread the reactions of others, thinking they will be angry, hurt, or defensive. We feel shame. Sometimes people hold grudges for years because neither they nor another will break down and make the first move. We feel fear. This sets us up for the classic story of the prodigal father, where we see two possible outcomes.

WELCOME HOME

The son returns home and, expecting the worst, confesses his sinfulness. His brother has an angry, self-righteous response, but the Father is full of joy and mercy. Such is the case in all the Gospel parables today. We hear God say, "You are the one who is important." There is another poignant song by Brian Flynn entitled "The Prodigal Father" that presents the perspective of the parent waiting and worrying about their lost child, watching the road and praying for the child's return. And if for some reason your own family will not accept you, you will find that there are many intentional families, friends, and parishes waiting with open arms to welcome you. Or perhaps you can offer the same welcome to another returning soul.


